As we enter the fourth wave of the pandemic, I'm truly grateful for the Sea Smart team, including our staff, board, advisors, volunteers, and supporters, for never giving up on us and helping us ride out this huge storm. Through this difficult time, ~1/3 of non-profits in North America have been estimated to close. The adaptability and perseverance of our team enabled Sea Smart to continue to deliver critical programs that empower people to make a positive and lasting impact on our oceans.

COVID-19 had positive short-term impacts on ocean health due to the reduction of various pressures that lead to overfishing, habitat loss, and climate change impacts. However, we cannot deny that COVID-19 has greatly exacerbated the **plastic pollution problem**, with an estimated global use of **129 billion** face masks and **65 billion gloves** every month. As the global economy returns to 'business as usual', our oceans will once again be under great threat and Sea Smart's work will be more important than ever. Although the pandemic has changed our delivery of in-person programs, we have been able to continue to power waves of change across Canada and beyond through virtual programs. In the past year, we educated a total of **210,934 students** from all of our education programs and resources, combined!

We look forward to teaching our students in person again. Sea Smart gives our deepest thanks for riding this wave of change with us as we coast through the pandemic and hop on the next wave! As the world continues along in these uncertain times, Sea Smart remains steadfast in our conviction to educate, inspire and empower people of all ages around the world to take action to protect our oceans.

WHY SHOULD I CARE ABOUT THE OCEAN?

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



WHY SEA SMART?

I've dedicated half of my life to ocean conservation as a marine biologist, studying endangered marine animals around the world for different governments and universities. When I finished my Ph.D., I realized over 30 of the species that I've studied or interacted with will go extinct within my lifetime. I couldn't see a direct link between my research and the immediate conservation action needed.

I believe strongly in the power of individual action to create positive change and how together, we can do so much more. I wanted to share my passion for ocean conservation with youth who still have a whole lifetime to create positive change for our oceans. This is why I started Sea Smart.

Our oceans need our help now. They are getting warmer and more acidic, coral reefs are dying, fish populations are collapsing, and many countries are treating the ocean like a trash can.

Now is the time to turn the tides on ocean threats. — Dr. Elaine Leung



144 Workshops delivered





YAT SHORELINE CLEANUPS

Students explored local beaches to conduct a shoreline cleanup with Sea Smart to continue their species at risk learning out in nature. We visited a different beach each session to make sure students created an impact far and wide! We also measured metrics such as the area of habitat cleaned, the weight of garbage removed and the number of cigarette butts removed. This data allowed teachers to share their students' efforts in a measurable and meaningful way!






